

What Goes In Your Bin?

PLASTIC FILM

Clean, Dry, & Free of Debris— Some plastic film items can be a little dirty. Please rinse and air-dry them if necessary.

Thin & Stretchy—If a plastic item it is thin and stretchy, and you can push your finger through it, it can go in the bin.

#2 or #4— If a plastic film item has a #2 or #4 printed on it, you can be doubly sure that it is accepted.

plastic mailers—both thin plastic and those padded with bubble wrap

bubble wrap and air pillows used in shipping

ziploc bags and grocery packaging with ziploc closure

sandwich bread bags AND any similar grocery packaging that is plastic film

stretch/shrink wrap (must be clean and dry)

over wrap from paper products (paper towels, toilet paper, etc)

PLASTIC FILM

plastic liner in cereal boxes

plastic retail shopping bags

newspaper sleeves

dry cleaning bags

produce bags—what you might put loose fruit or vegetables in at the grocery store

furniture and electronic wrap

grocery bags - the single-use bags that are not used at our grocery stores anymore

ELECTRONICS

laptops, tablets, cell phones

gaming consoles/systems & video games

external hard drives

charging cables and insulated cables/wires

printer cartridges

routers and modems

mice & similar accessories

CLOTHING, SHOES, & LINENS

clothing - all conditions accepted

shoes - all types accepted

accessories - hats, purses, belts, jewelry

linens - sheets, pillowcases, blankets, table linens, quilts

MISCELLANEOUS

eyeglasses - prescription, readers, & sunglasses

paper egg cartons

paper towel & to rolls

small cardboard tube from roll of dog waste bags

wine corks - natural cork

alkaline batteries

contact lenses & plastic packaging

CFL light bulbs

LED string lights

stuffed animals

plastic tabs from bread bags
